Environmental Management Capacities for Cabo Delgado

What is it about?

Introduction of the “*environmental-management-course*” in the northernmost province of Mozambique.

Why an intervention?

In the year 2010 the possibilities of studying a university course in the city of Pemba were very limited, as only 3 courses were offered. Therefore a general interest in expanding the range of courses offered existed.

What does it change?

- Students gain knowledge on environmental processes, problems and solutions.
- Students improve their professional qualifications.
- Environmental awareness and conditions in general improve through information and activities implemented by the students and the Department.
- Establishment of a new course, which is highly demanded by the students, contributes to the reputation of the faculty as well as the economic sustainability of the faculty location.

How does it work?

- Identification of a local demand for a new, specific course, not offered up to this time at the location.
- Elaboration of a curriculum in collaboration with specialists and local stakeholders.
- Employment of lecturers for the new course.
- Accompaniment of the introduction of the new course by a technical advisor (definition and refinement of programmatic-contents of lectures, implementation of practical hours, supervision of first thesis, etc.)
- Participation of the Department in the regional Working Group on Development
- Students spreading environmental knowledge in schools

Who are the beneficiaries?

- Students (mainly from Pemba, but also from other cities and the Cabo Delgado Province in general)
- Population of the city of Pemba
- Civil society, public and private institutions of Cabo Delgado
- UCM-FGTI

Who could use that approach?

Universities having (or thinking of opening) faculties at remote locations with development in a very specific area going on, public authorities in areas with environmental challenges.

Who is already using it?

Catholic University of Mozambique, Faculty of Tourism and Information Technology (UCM-FGTI), Pemba, Cabo Delgado, Mozambique.
